HOUSING REHABILITATION

Funding to conduct housing rehabilitation, relocation, removal or new construction activities for eligible low and moderate income residents.

NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION

CDBG funding for a variety of neighborhood improvement projects that may include utility and drainage, paving, sidewalks, lighting, fire protection, removal of architectural barriers and numerous other neighborhood and community development/improvement projects to prevent continuing deterioration, crime, health and safety problems for low- and moderate-income residents.

COMMERCIAL REVITALIZATION

Funding to improve the downtown commercial districts to promote business in areas where there is a general decline in commercial activity. This program may include storefront improvements, sidewalks, mall walks, lighting improvements, paving, curbing and litter receptacles, utility line replacements, parking and other activities that promote increased business activity. These activities are designed to increase municipal tax bases while creating greater opportunities for jobs.


ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

funding on a 50/50 public and private investment development project designed to generate business activity through the creation of new jobs in Florida. These funds may be used for a variety of job creation projects such as manufacturing plants, industrial park developments, and labor intensive retail businesses such as restaurants. These funds may be used for land acquisition, capital needs, utilities, building construction, and may be used for new or expanded business activity that creates one new-to-Florida job for each \$35,000 of CDBG funds used for the project.

CDBG FUNDING AMOUNTS

FDEO will make up to \$24.8 million in FFY 2021 funding and approximately \$23 million in FFY 2022 funding available to eligible applicants in the four program areas listed above.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF WHITE SPRINGS, HAMILTON COUNTY, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AS THE CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIAL OF THE TOWN COUNCIL TO MAKE APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF FLORIDA, DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY, SMALL CITIES COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM, UNDER THE COMBINED FFY2021 & FFY2022; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, The Town of White Springs is experiencing a need for physical improvements in one or more neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, The Town of White Springs is experiencing a need for economic improvement and sustainability; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Town of White Springs that local residents be assisted in creating an improved living and working environment in these areas.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WHITE SPRINGS authorizes the Mayor to act in connection with the grant and is authorized to sign correspondence and documents on behalf of the Town;

SECTION 1. That the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program is declared to be a workable program for providing needed physical improvements to benefit the low-to-moderate income residents indicated in the FFY2021 & FFY2022 CDBG application.

SECTION 2. The Town Council of the Town of White Springs herby directs the Mayor of the Town to sign all necessary certifications of the CDBG application.

SECTION 3. The Town Council of the Town of White Springs directs the Mayor to execute and submit the CDBG application to the State of Florida, Department of Economic Opportunity for approval and in his/her absence directs the Town Manager to execute the application and all subsequent documents.

SECTION 4. The Mayor or the Town Manager in his/her absence, is authorized and directed to submit additional information in a timely manner as may be required by the State of Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

SECTION 5. The proposed CDBG application is consistent with the local comprehensive plan.

SECTION 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
